After my death I don't want any unsettled business to interfere with the division of my property.

As to me making out a statement of what I owe you, is out of the question. It is up to you Mr. Himes to do that. And your expression that

"I do not consider that you owe him any thing" and what you say of yourself, "I do not feel that you owe me any thing" does not count in the eyes of the law. Those expressions simply accentuate the fact that I am in your debt and you must make out a statement of my indebtedness to you, or else, a receipt in full of account to date.
